DHT monitored and tracked pupil progress and attainment of Pupil Premium pupils identifying if children were making expected , above or below expected progress . This allowed suitable interventions to be put in place to support individual pupils . Term on term tracking and monitoring showing attainment in line with non-Pupil Premium pupils . Improvements to attendance for PP pupils with majority in line with non-PP pupils Improved home /school communication and relationships . Positive feedback from parents/carers, annual parental questionnaires , parental meetings .
